Fayette Fiscal Court Special Meeting Minutes 4/08/2021

Location: VIA VIDEO TELECONFERENCE DUE TO COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS, Meeting hosted on the Zoom platform by the Fayette County Clerk

Present: County Judge/Executive Donald W. Blevins, Sr., District 1 County Commissioner Bob Pattie, District 2 County Commissioner VACANT, District 3 County Commissioner Chrysanthia Carr-Seals, Meredith Watson (Fayette County Clerk), Andrew Grunwald (LFUCG Div. of Engineering), Doug Burton (LFUCG Div. of Engineering), Rob Allen (LFUCG Div. of Streets & Roads), Bill Osborne (LFUCG Div. of Streets & Roads), Kathy Plomin (LFUCG Councilmember District 12), Eve Wallingford (LFUCG District 12 Council Legislative Aide), Scott Garthee (LFUCG Div. of Streets & Roads), Mark Feibes (LFUCG Div. of Engineering), Kerri Dauteuil (LFUCG Div. of Engineering), Shane Tucker (Ky. Transportation Cabinet District 7), Casey Smith (Ky. Transportation Cabinet District 7), and Fred Siegelman (Ky. Transportation Cabinet Central Kentucky Representative for Rural Road Municipal Aid).

1:30 p.m.: Mr. Blevins called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone present.

Mr. Blevins asked for any additions or corrections to the Minutes of the July 16, 2020, and July 30, 2020, Fiscal Court meetings, distributed earlier. There were no additions or corrections.

Mr. Pattie made a motion, seconded by Ms. Carr-Seals, to approve the Minutes of the July 16 and July 30, 2020, Fiscal Court meetings. The motion was approved by majority vote.

Old Business

Review of County Road Program for FY 2021. Mr. Grunwald reported that the paving program had been suspended until recently due to pandemic delays. The asphalt plants were just starting to reopen. He stated that the Fayette County Public Schools had completed the repair of the Kentucky River Parkway at Jacks Creek Pike, and thanked them for the work.

New Business

Consideration of Resolution approving the 2021-2022 Rural Secondary Program and Flex Fund Program for Fayette County (Ky. Transportation Cabinet). Mr. Grunwald spoke about the program, and explained how the flex fund program works in returning monies allotted to the county to the state to repave recommended roads. Recommended roads for the Rural Secondary Program this year include 2.968 miles of Bryan Station Road (KY 1970), and recommended for Flex Funds include 0.277 miles of Bryan Station Road (KY 1970), and 1.250 miles of Jacks Creek Pike (KY 1975). Mr. Smith spoke about the origin and use of the funds, and the recommendations from the Ky. Transportation Cabinet.

Mr. Smith requested a motion to approve the recommendations for repaving with Rural Secondary and Flex Funds.

Ms. Carr-Seals asked whether one or two motions would be required for approval of use of these funds. Mr. Grunwald explained that it would be one motion to accept the program recommendations and agreement.

Mr. Blevins asked for additional information about the agreement to be approved. Mr. Grunwald responded.

Mr. Pattie made a motion, seconded by Ms. Carr-Seals, to approve the recommendations for the Rural Secondary and Flex Funds along with the agreement to be signed by Judge-Executive. The motion was approved by unanimous vote.

Discussion of new project and streets to be paved for FY 2022. Mr. Grunwald stated the Div. of Engineering had received several recommendations for repaving from Councilmember Plomin's office including Shelby Lane, Walnut Hill Chilesburg, Columbus Lane, Dolan Lane, Hume Road, and Payne's Mill Road. Mr. Grunwald noted that Columbus Lane was resurfaced approximately five years ago, but that there was a portion at the end that was undone. Councilmember Plomin and Ms. Wallingford confirmed that they had been in communication with Commissioner Albright, LFUCG Dept. of Environmental Quality and Public Works, regarding a culvert at the end of Columbus Lane.

Mr. Blevins asked if any federal COVID relief funds would be able to be used for repaving. Councilmember Plomin responded that it was a possibility, but that the budget was still in the working stages and information would not be detailed until May. Mr. Blevins expressed his hope that some extra monies may be available.

Mr. Grunwald stated that a final list of streets to be paved would be presented at the next Fiscal Court meeting. Mr. Blevins asked if any citizen requests had been submitted to his office. Ms. Watson responded that she was not aware of any.

Councilmember Plomin summarized the requests from the Council District 12 office: Dolan Lane, Hume Road, Payne's Mill, Shelby Lane, and Walnut Hill.

Mr. Osborne stated he believe one section of Dolan Lane had been paved. Mr. Osborne and Mr. Grunwald agreed to investigate the road.

Consideration of County Agreement with LFUCG (FY 2022). Mr. Blevins asked if that agreement had already been prepared. Mr. Grunwald explained that the boilerplate agreement was prepared and would just need the specifics of the streets to be repaved inserted. No action was needed at that time.

Mr. Blevins asked if there were any citizens who wished to speak. There were none. Mr. Blevins thanked Councilmember Plomin for participating.

Mr. Siegelman introduced himself as the new Rural Roads representative for municipal aid for Central Kentucky from the Ky. Transportation Cabinet, and provided his contact phone number, (502) 229-9041. Mr. Blevins welcomed him.

Mr. Grunwald introduced Ms. Kerri Dauteuil, new to the LFUCG Div. of Engineering, who will be shadowing Mr. Grunwald.

Mr. Blevins gave an update on the Fayette District 2 commissioner seat, vacated by the incumbent due to relocation out of the district, and stated he had been in touch with the Governor's Office regarding an appointment to the seat. No appointment had yet been made.

Ms. Carr-Seals asked if a Fayette District 2 map could be made available. Ms. Watson will obtain and send out a map.

There being no further discussion, Mr. Blevins asked for a motion to adjourn.

Upon motion of Mr. Pattie, seconded by Ms. Carr-Seals, the meeting adjourned at 1:55 p.m. by unanimous vote.
